# Purpose of our evaluation

**To better understand what works to get the very least active disabled and non-disabled people active together**

**Through GOGA evaluation we want to:**

- Understand the cumulative impact of the GOGA approach
- Generate evidence to feed into future priorities and programmes to reach the very least active
- Understand how GOGA operates and how we can maximise the investment and its impact



# Evaluation principles



Through our evaluation, we want to:

- Learn through doing! (Action research)
- Minimise burden: evaluation activities proportionate to intensity of engagement
- Ensure deliverers deliver and evaluators evaluate!
- Use standardised and validated tools and questions
- Avoid duplication in information requests – evaluation and programme management team working as one!

# GOGA Theory of change

## Resources:

- £4.5m (Spirit of 2012)
- Match funding
- Expert local and national expertise to shape delivery

## Rationale:

- Lack of participation presents a huge cost to individual health and well-being
- Disabled people are half as likely to be active as non-disabled people
- Certain groups, of which there is increased prevalence of disability, are more likely than others to be inactive
- People's perceptions of self and others has a huge impact on engagement in activity and connectivity to community

## Long(er) term outcomes (impact):

More happier, healthy, inclusive communities

Previously inactive individuals remain active post interventions

Each project area is left with a sustainable system

Transferable learning capable of being applied to a wide range of programmes and policy

Positive change in the perception of disabled people in communities

Address inequalities in volunteer engagement

People feel more engaged in their local community

Organisations more informed to better connect to the very least active

Greater number of inclusion champions

## Activities:

Recruitment of locality management and delivery staff

Partnership building/strengthening and influencing

Community consultation

Resourcing and delivering genuinely inclusive existing or new activities

Outreach /engagement of participants and volunteers

Training of workforce

Implementation of monitoring and evaluation systems

## Outputs:

- 16,500 unique participants
- 2,000 volunteers

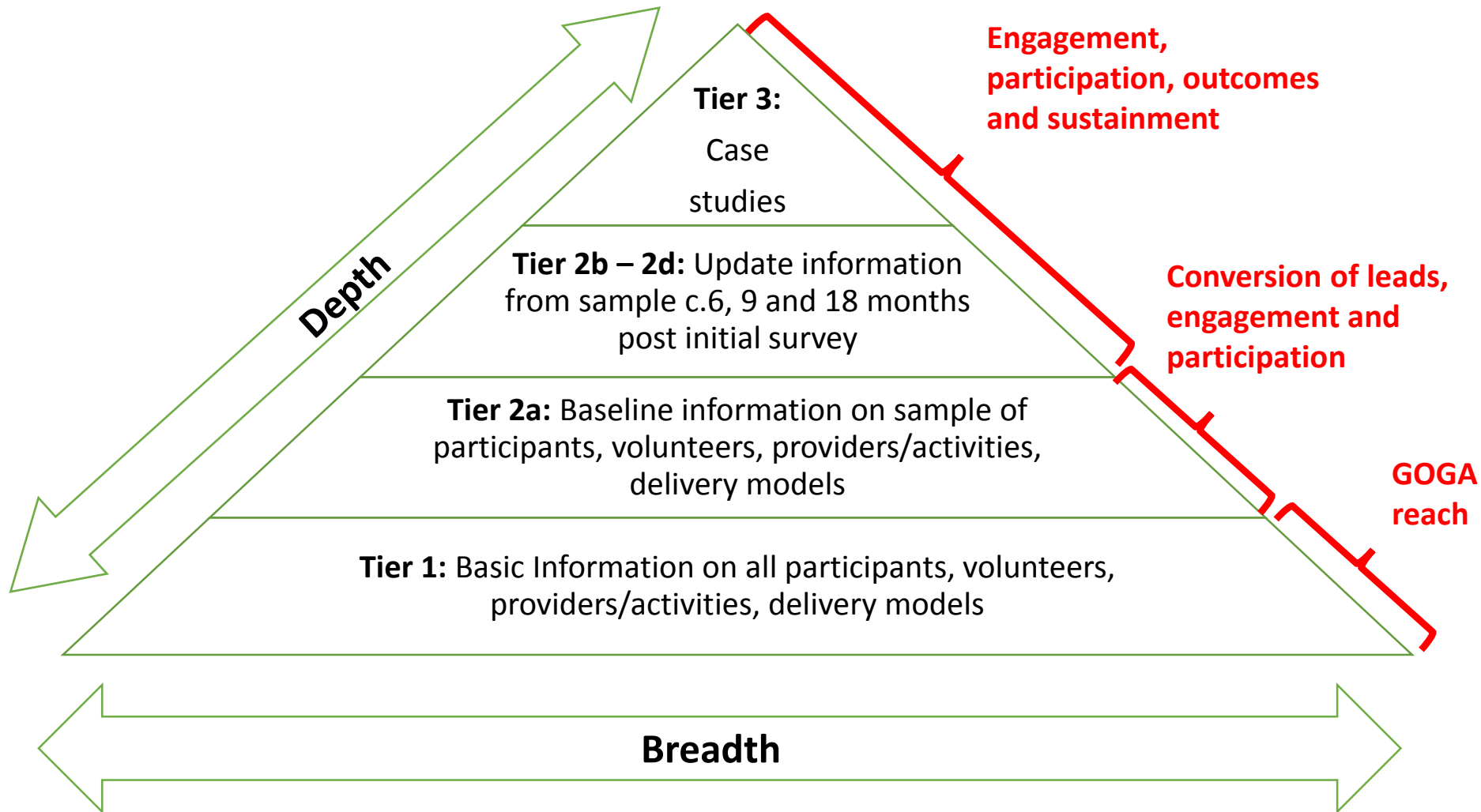
## Outcomes:

- Reduction of inactivity levels
- Improved physical and mental wellbeing
- Improved social connectedness
- Learning captured through evaluation and disseminated to programme and external partners

## Assumptions:

- That the 'GOGA' approach is transferable, scalable and sustainable in other localities with specific targeted groups
- That there is demand amongst potential coaches/mentors to undertake training provision that will support their engagement and support of key target, inactive groups
- That localities are able to identify and recruit participants from key target groups
- That participation in activity leads to:
  - Increases in personal well-being
  - Increased social inclusivity and improved community cohesion
  - Health and wellbeing benefits that improve the lifestyles of those participating and enhance their long term 'lived' experience.
  - Reduced burdens on health and support services for disabled people that reduces costs and demand for longer term support.
